# Tournament Selection

Atlanta Junior Golf is proud to present its 37th season of junior golf in 2011. Because of the steadfast support of more than 70 facilities across the metro Atlanta area, we are able to offer one of our best tournament schedules to date. With almost 7,000 tee times available this summer and playing opportunities nearly every weekday during June and July, we hope you'll join us often on the course for some great tournaments.



Summer Series tournament selection opens for some returning members on Wednesday, March 16. All new members will begin selecting tournaments on Wednesday, March 23. Juniors are notified via e-mail when cleared to register for events. Those players with the most seniority (determined by the year the junior first joined) will have the opportunity to select courses first. The 2011 tournament selection schedule is as follows:

- Siblings may register for tournaments on the same date. Once any sibling (typically the most senior) has been cleared to select events, all remaining siblings may add tournaments to their schedules.
- In order to be eligible to qualify for a *Season Ending-Championship* (Club Championship, 9-Hole Classic or Grand Championship) juniors in all age divisions must participate in at least five (5) events within their age group.
- For the initial registration period (**Wednesday, March 16** through **Wednesday, May 18**), juniors in all divisions are limited to selecting a maximum of six (6) tournaments. At **9:00 am** on **Wednesday, May 18**, all remaining tee times in events will be available for players on a first-come, first-served basis. After this date there is no maximum number of events in which a player may participate, provided there is space remaining in tournaments within their division.

## AJG Welcomes Back Match Play Championship

As the growth of the match play format continues in the professional and amateur ranks, Atlanta Junior Golf is proud to announce the Match Play Championship will return in 2011. This year 32 boys and 8 girls will compete to become the Atlanta Junior Golf Match Play Champions. The flex scheduling allows for junior golfers to schedule their matches with their opponents at pre-existing *Summer Series* tournaments. The entry fee for the Match Play Championship is \$40. Registration is open to any junior ages 13-18 in the 18-Hole Divisions.

# Season-Ending Championships



Both the Beginner Open and Club Championship will return to familiar sites for the 2011 season. The Beginner Open visits Hawks Ridge Golf Club for the fifth consecutive year, while the Club Championship will return to City Club Marietta for the fourth time. Both courses provide the perfect test for players that participate in the Beginner and Club Divisions.

The Beginner Open is available for any Beginner Division player with no qualification requirements. Registration opens March 16th and players are encouraged to register early as spots fill quickly. Club Division players are required to play in a minimum of five (5) *Summer Series* tournaments and earn points before being eligible for the Club Championship. The tournament allows players to showcase their skills developed during the summer months at this culminating championship.

After three seasons south of Atlanta at Callaway Gardens, the Grand Championship moves northward to Chateau Elan Resort, home for the 2011 tournament. In 2007, 118 players competed on the 7,030 yard course resulting in a highly competitive event. Randy White took home top honors as Overall Boys' Grand Champion, while Mariah Stackhouse claimed top honors in the Girls' Division. The course will play tough again this year as the Association's top contenders converge for the 54-hole championship.

The 9-Hole Classic joins the Grand Championship at Chateau Elan Resort. The Chateau course will host the top players in the 9-Hole Open Divisions for a two-day 18-hole competition and give players the opportunity to see what lies ahead for them at the Grand Championships.



# Rules Section

If there is one thing that all amateur golfers, juniors included, can learn from professionals, it is most certainly that knowing the Rules of Golf can help or hurt in a big way. Unfortunately, more times than not, learning this lesson comes at the expense of the player.

The PGA and European Tours were only a few weeks into the season before two of golf's top players were leaving the tournament early. During the first round of the PGA Tour's Hyundai Tournament of Champions, Camilo Villegas found himself in violation of Rule 23-1. The Rules of Golf states that "when a ball is in motion, a loose impediment that might influence the movement of the ball must not be removed." Villegas clearly violated this Rule when he casually removed a divot while his ball was rolling back to his feet after a poor pitch. He should have been penalized two strokes for the infraction but the incident went unnoticed. Seems like a harmless mistake, add two strokes and move on right? Not in this case.

Since Villegas was unaware of his mistake, he failed to include the incurred two stroke penalty before returning his score card. In fact, the Rules infraction was not brought to the attention of the PGA Tour Rules Committee until a T.V. viewer called and informed them of Villegas' infraction sometime later. Subsequently, since Villegas failed to include the two additional strokes on the 15th hole, he was later disqualified for



returning a score lower than what he actually made on that hole. Fair or unfair? It is the burning question that has the golf world turned upside-down.

Two weeks later at the European Tour's Abu Dhabi Championship, Padraig Harrington encountered a similar situation. This time Harrington accidentally moved his ball in play while picking up his ball marker from the putting green. Harrington would have not been penalized for the infraction if he had replaced the ball to its original spot since it was directly attributable to the act marking or replacing his golf ball (Rule 20-1). However, since Harrington neglected to replace his golf ball to the original spot he incurred the general penalty under Rule 18. Just like Villegas, Harrington was unaware of his infraction and uninformed of the violation until after he had returned his score card upon the completion of his round. This time, it was a viewer's e-mail that would bring Harrington's rules violation to light, and like Villegas, resulted in his disqualification.

Both violations led to major debates about whether or not viewers should be able to phone or e-mail in violations that occur during a round. The violations have also caused the USGA and R&A to examine how they will handle these situations in the future. Should a golfer be disqualified if they were unaware of an infraction that occurred until after signing their scorecard? Has viewer interaction gone too far? Every sport is implementing more and more technology to get the rule right so is golf going to be the exception? Do we want to take away technology so we do not get the right ruling?

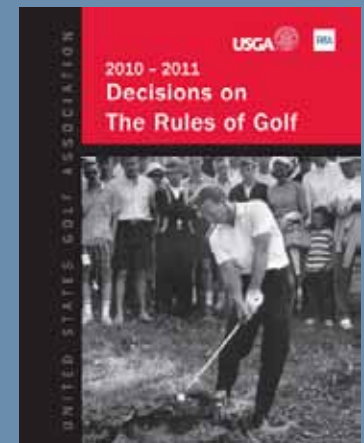
## RULES TIP - PRESENTED BY THE USGA AND ATLANTA JUNIOR GOLF

### Rule 18: Ball at Rest Moved

Decision 18-1/12

**Q:** A player replaces his ball on the putting green and the ball is at rest. Before the player addresses the ball, a sudden gust of wind blows the ball farther from the hole. The player plays the ball from its new position. Is that correct?

**A:** Yes. Wind is not an outside agency. Accordingly, Rule 18-1 does not apply. The player would play the ball from its new position even if the ball was moved closer to the hole.
